4. Project/Program Description

To help fund the construction of a 6000 sq ft conservation education center onsite of Cedar Lakes Woods and Gardens botanical garden near Williston FL, Levy County. This education center will include a multi-purpose room capable of hosting 100 participants in workshops and events educating them on conservation and reclamation issues. In addition, the facility will serve as host for 3rd Party events educating the public on a host of conservation issues including the Florida Aquifer and water quality, reclamation projects, wildlife conservation, and youth conservation and literacy pograms. The facility will be single story, handcapped accessible and feature environmental efficiencies.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To construct an onsite conservation education center to host workshops and clinics regarding conservation and habitat topics, and to act as an entrance to the Gardens for its 50,000 annual visitors.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The conservation education center will host workshops and clinics regarding conservation and habitat restoration topics, hosted by a number of regional conservation and youth organizations.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Workshops and clinics provided to the public will educate them about the importance of the Florida Aquifer, which is exposed at the Gardens as a series of shallow lakes, and about habitat conservation. It will also offer local employment, and a strong eco-tourism revenue generator for the region.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Of the 50,000 visitors each year, half come from around Florida and half from around the USA. For the daily visitors, the education center will host short clinics and have static multi-media displays. It will also schedule day-long clinics for the public in the region that will be conducted by partner programming agencies.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The expected outcome will be an increase of visitors who attend short clinics and return to attend long clinics, and who demonstrate an increased knowledge and appreciation for the Florida Aquifer and the surrounding woodlands. The methodology will be to track participation and satisfaction levels of the agencies conducting the clinics.
