The Florida Community Literacy Fund will serve low-skilled adults in Florida, especially those in the most vulnerable populations. This initiative will support community-based education providers that have shown a unique ability to reach—and effectively serve—underserved populations. Through a competitive grant application process, this program will support the expanded use of trained volunteers and paraprofessionals to teach adults reading, writing, math, English language, digital literacy and workforce readiness skills.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Community-based adult literacy programs provide the first rung on the skills development ladder with a focus on helping underserved adult learners to develop fundamental reading, writing, math, English language and workforce readiness skills. This initiative will support trained volunteers to provide instruction to Florida's low-literate adults, by awarding 20-40 grants to non-profit and library-based literacy programs through a competitive application process.

Existing Florida statute (Title XLVIII, Chapter 1004.94) already provides for funding such community-based literacy programs. This statute, which has never been funded, provides for local grant awards of up to \$50,000. Priority is given to "paying expenses related to the instruction of volunteer tutors, including materials and the salary of the program coordinator."

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Florida Literacy Coalition will manage a competitive grant application and distribution process to make 20-40 grants available to non-profit and library-based literacy programs throughout Florida. Funds will be used to support and expand local adult literacy, ESL and family literacy instruction.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funds will be used to provide direct one-on-one and group instruction to adult learners who need to develop fundamental reading, writing, math, English language, digital literacy and workforce readiness skills.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Approximately one in four adults in Florida cannot read and write above a third-grade level. This project will serve adults and families who need to develop and/or improve their English language and literacy skills. Our goal is to serve at least 2,700 students for the year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The majority of participating adult students (provided with at least 25 hours of instruction) will achieve a measurable educational gain and/or achievement toward a personal educational goal. This project will use established adult education assessment tools.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Funds administered through this grant program will be used for the stated purpose or refunded. Grant funded organizations who don't meet performance measures may be subject to loss of funding and eligibility for future funding.
