a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Elementary students in Duval will participate in career exposure activities through the use of a mobile CTE lab. The lab will travel across the school district, providing an on-campus "field trip" for students to enhance their understanding of career opportunities in our community. In addition, 4th and 5th grade students will participate in curriculum to prepare for digital tool certification.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Hands-on experience in high-need industries in our local area. In addition, creating curriculum for students to authentically engage with digital skills and earn certifications will directly prepare students for middle and high school.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Create a mobile lab that will expand access to career and technology education opportunities. Our unit will travel to elementary schools throughout the district to expose students to STEM and CTE. Making full use of the mobile's unique classroom setting, students get hands-on experience in construction, plumbing, and woodworking, to name a few.
