14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



The program will consist of several components that will address how to react and respond to interaction with law enforcement. The purpose of the program is to enlighten the community on how and why law enforcement officers react to certain situations the way they do and how citizens should interact with law enforcement in order to minimize an unpleasant encounter. The program also offers citizens' perspectives on how they see law enforcement in certain situations. The goal is to work toward positive interactions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Community engagement training classes/seminars that will include law enforcement and mental health facilitators and interactive lessons. Stop the bleed training by certified instructors to teach basic fist aid for incidents such as active shooter. Developing a dialogue between local police and citizens to facilitate better understandings of policy and procedures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Adults and youth will be participants in training and open dialogue with law enforcement and mental health professionals. Law enforcement will expand on their role and teach citizens best responses when interacting with law enforcement in various situations. A variety of materials and activities will be used to foster a better understanding and relationship.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The community at large (Duval County) and Students at Bethune Cookman University (Volusia County). Elderly, Jobless, economically disadvantaged, at risk youth, homeless, all students, formerly incarcerated persons, crime victims and the public in general.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is education and relationship building as well as First Aid skills and Mental Health Reporter awareness. The outcome will be measured by end of course assignments/quiz, summary discussions, After course referrals and surveys.

Improve mental health, enrich cultural experiences, improve quality of education, protect the general public from harm such as crime.
