a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of the project is to help the community with much needed drainage upgrades along the following boundaries: Area encompassing SW 30th Street to the North; Countyline Road to the South; SW 32nd Avenue to the East; and SW 48th Avenue to the West. This will help with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) support and foster public benefit to residents and business owners within the community. The proposed improvement will provide much needed water quality standards and required flood mitigation. These improvements will include a) catch basins; b) drainage pipes and drainage outlets; c) trenches; d) curbs; e) gutters; and f) drainage structures.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The proposed improvement will provide much needed water quality standards and required flood mitigation. These much-needed construction improvements will include a) catch basins; b) drainage pipes and drainage outlets; c) trenches; d) curbs; e) gutters; and f) drainage structures. These improvements will also assist with minimizing property damage (vehicles and homes) with heavy rain fall, ponding, or water intrusion. In addition, students and pedestrians will have less exposure to the harms caused by walking through flood waters (loss of clothing, mosquito bites, etc.). Research shows, moving water can knock a pedestrian down and sweep a vehicle away.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services that will be provided to citizens will include updated wastewater system with better connectivity and water quality. Customize drainage consisting of high-quality French drains used to incept water, which eradicates flood opportunities, and threat to life and property. The project will help the community to meet National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements by addressing erosion and sediment control. These improvements will also assist with minimizing property damage (vehicles and homes) with heavy rainfall or ponding water. In addition, students and pedestrians will have less exposure to the harms caused by walking through flood waters (loss of clothing, mosquito bites, etc.). Research shows, moving water can knock a pedestrian down and sweep a vehicle away.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served will be the residents of the City of West Park. Regardless of age, gender, race, income level, or any other demographics, residents will be the target population. Business owners will also benefit from these much-needed drainage upgrades. We expect this project to impact 2,000 people (motorists, pedestrians, students, Americans with Disabilities Act. etc.).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit or outcome for this project will be as follows: The measurable outcome will be an improved water and wastewater system with better connectivity and water quality. The area has poorly designed surface drainage system with opportunities for illicit connection and discharge. There can also be propensity for flooding, mosquitoes and threat to life and property. Funds will help customize drainage consisting of high-quality French drains used to incept water, which eradicates flood opportunities, and threat to life and property. Our methodology will be reduced flooding and better connectivity for residents, businesses, visitors, pedestrians and motorists. The project will also conform with ADA.
