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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The objective is to accurately identify and comprehend the origins of nutrient additions influencing the aquifer and groundwater by employing chemical and molecular markers.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The University will use the funds to support activities such as comprehensive water sampling, molecular analysis, and hydrological monitoring, as well as the provision of personnel and equipment necessary for identifying and addressing nutrient sources, ultimately working towards improving water quality at Wakulla Spring.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Florida State University Coastal and Marine Lab students will experience a tangible enhancement in the quality of their education, gaining valuable firsthand experience through active involvement in the project.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funding requested will directly benefit citizens by supporting research activities focused on identifying and remediating nutrient sources impacting Wakulla Spring's water quality, safeguarding the region's economy, preserving property values, and ensuring the long-term health of the aquatic ecosystem.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Qualitative assessments, such as observed changes in the diversity and abundance of fish and wildlife populations in and around Wakulla Spring, will contribute to evaluating the overall success and impact of the remediation efforts.
