14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Child Advocacy Centers are responsible for the coordination and facilitation of the Multidisciplinary Teams in their communities which ensures services are provided to children who are victims of physical and sexual abuse, trafficking, witness to crime, are drug endangered, those who witness domestic violence, and more. This project is to help maintain level services to victims of crime for CACs experiencing budget cuts from VOCA due to the deficit in the Crime Victims Fund.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Florida's CACs will use Bridge the Gap- VOCA state funding to facilitate the multidisciplinary team approach to childabuse investigations in their communities and provide direct services, training, and technical supports to partners and child victims of abuse. The Florida Network of CAC, supports the CACs at a statewide level to promote the national model and standards of accreditation established by the National Children's Alliance and will provide monitoring and technical assistance to CACs receiving funds under this project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Core CAC Services to include victim advocacy, trauma-informed mental health, case management, forensic interviews, medical evaluations, and psychiatric evaluations will be provided to citizens through this project. Additionally, coordination and facilitation of current best practices and training modalities will be offered to multidisciplinary teams in the state by the Florida Network of CACs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project are child-victims of abuse and their families, multidisciplinary partners such as law enforcement, state attorneys offices, mental health professionals, etc., and local community stakeholders. CACs report serving over 30,000 children in 2022. We anticipate that the projects from this fund will provide service to approximately 10,000 children.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit from funding for this project is to help CACs maintain level services to child victims in their communities. CACs provide monthly financial invoices, data reports, and are monitored by the FNCAC both virtually and in-person. The National Children's Alliance's standards of accreditation require that each individual center collect initial and follow-up surveys from families and the multidisciplinary partners either through the Outcome Measurement System available at a national level or their through own standard practice. The FNCAC may review survey results at any time. The FNCAC administers a bi-annual Membership Survey to its members in order to continuously improve its services and engagement with CACs.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
