a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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The primary quantitative goal of this project is to expedite the transformation of Roosevelt Elementary from a D-rated school to an A-rated school. In doing so, expected outcomes include filling the 461 surplus seats, improving reading literacy and math proficiency rates, and increasing teacher retention and satisfaction. Funding will be specifically used for the procurement of program material and program implementation.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Implement project-based learning initiatives to improve the quality of the existing D-rated school, such as block-based coding, outside field observation projects, the artist-in-residence program, and structured opportunities for students to present their learning to the school, family, and community guests. Programs include music and STEM education along with student support programs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Student support programs will enrich student education through phonics, research, and literacy training. The allocated funds will support a dynamic curriculum and programs that integrate these disciplines, fostering an interactive and collaborative learning environment. Through this initiative, we aim to elevate the educational experience for existing and future students as well as teachers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 800 individuals are expected to be served. Economically Disadvantaged Students, at- risk youth, Preschool students, Grade School Students

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Promotes education by offering an engaging, hands-on approach. This strategy sparks curiosity, encourages active participation, and cultivates a positive attitude towards learning, ultimately fostering a culture of academic enthusiasm and achievement. It enables interactive, real-world learning experiences, fostering critical thinking and practical skills. This investment addresses educational gaps, empowering students with tools for academic success and future opportunities. Method of measuring performance improvements are: math proficiency and reading literacy, increased enrollment rate, reduced drop-out rate, increased teacher engagement.

Penalties may include financial deductions proportional to the shortfall, a structured improvement plan with specified timelines, and, if persistent, termination of the contract.
