a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of this program funding request is to bring Florida to the forefront of national security innovation and talent development with impacts at national, state, and local levels. The specific program goals are to: 1) Position FINS for long-term federal funding in national security by supporting seed projects, infrastructure, and human capital that align with the needs of intelligence, defense, and law enforcement agencies; 2) Spur local patenting and entrepreneurship for the transition of trustworthy, defense-grade solutions to Florida's High-Tech Corridor and state/local law enforcement agencies; 3) Develop a robust, multi-disciplinary workforce that addresses the widely recognized talent deficit in national security by preparing qualified US citizens for roles in government positions that require security clearances and connecting them to appropriate intelligence/defense employers in the government and industrial base.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

1) Growing the Institute's staff, principal investigators, and research scientists to increase research capacity; 2) Transitioning academic research into state-of-the-art national security technology solutions; 3) Conducting technical exchanges with intelligence, law enforcement, and defense organizations in support of their missions 4) Developing the national security workforce through education and training initiatives; 5.) Establishing collaborative partnerships with national security-related entities, including those from federal and state governments as well as industry.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Education, training, and job opportunities with local, state and federal entities, as well as the defense industrial base.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida taxpayers will benefit from the technologies that modernize and improve the efficiency of state/local law enforcement. All Florida residents will be safer due to the training, independent evaluations, and trustworthy, defense-grade solutions provided to state and local law enforcement agencies. The project's talent pipeline program with benefit job seeking students who are US citizens, veterans, and active military members as well as the intelligence/defense agencies looking to fill national security positions.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Outcomes: 1) Fill nationwide gaps in national security workforce; 2) Increase tech, data, and knowledge transfer with state/local law enforcement; 3) Stimulate Florida job growth in national security; 4) Obtain sole-source federal funding for FINS.

Measures: 1) Institute research expenditures and national security partnerships established.; 2) Number of projects and partnerships with state/local law enforcement; 3) Number of technologies transitioned to operation; 3) Number of invention disclosures, patents, and companies launched by FINS faculty and alumni; 4.) Number of individuals benefiting from workforce development initiatives.
