### 4. Project/Program Description

CFUL's STEM Family Enrichment Program was created to uplift local families by leveraging the incredible STEM opportunities within Central Florida, in partnership with CareerSource Central FL, Valencia College, Orange County Public Schools, DJJ, Central Florida Tourism District, and other partners. This program will target 1,000 local youth, providing them a foundation in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math, allowing them the opportunity to explore these core subjects with the goals of increasing student achievement in the near term, as well sparking an interest in these advanced areas of study. Youth will be enrolled in a total of 160 hours of programming on a bi-weekend basis, focusing on information technology, engineering, physical sciences, biology, gaming, virtual reality and hands-on engagement. Simultaneously, CFUL and its partners will engage the parents and family members of these youth through STEM upskilling opportunities and job coaching.

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will help the CFUL establish a program to provide youth with a fundamental foundation in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. This program target students who are underachieving in these areas and allows them the opportunity to explore these core subjects with the ultimate goal of sparking an interest in these advanced areas of study. This program will target 1,000 at-risk youth in Orange, Seminole, and Volusia Counties.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

(1) Academic remediation to address low levels of student academic performance in reading, writing, science and mathematics; (2) Service learning and community awareness; (3) Entrepreneurial education and mentoring to address high unemployment rates and poverty; and (4) Parent services to address low educational levels via upskilling, enhance parenting skills and improve parental involvement.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

(1) Increase the number of STEM college majors; (2) Serve as a diversion program for at-risk youth; (3) Encourage minorities, who are severely underrepresented in said arena, to seek out a future in one of the STEM fields of study; (4) Help students reach their full potential; (5) Provide educational opportunities to parents to help them qualify for indemand, high-wage employment.

This program will target 1,000 at-risk youth in Orange, Seminole, and Volusia Counties

Outcome: Increase in student achievement, increased interest in pursuing a STEM career. Method for Measuring: Pre and Post tests for each student, Florida Assessment of Student Learning (FAST), progress monitoring tools, career interest surveys
