1. Project Title North Lauderdale Propane Gas Fueled Live Fire Training System

4. Project/Program Description

North Lauderdale Fire Rescue (NLFR) requests funds to purchase necessary equipment in order to provide specialized fire training for fire rescue recruits and personnel to mitigate liquid petroleum gas fire incidents. Equipment needed consists of automobile firefighting prop, pit fire training, and a LP tank to simulate tank container fires. Florida Statute 69A-37.060 - Certification as an Approved Firefighter Recruit Training Facility - requires a liquefied petroleum gas firefighting field equipped with training props to provide training for automobile firefighting, pit fire training fuel, and a 500 gallon LP Tank to simulate a tank fire equipped with a shut off valve so students can approach the tank fire with a hose line and properly shut down the proper valves. Funding for live fire training utilizing LP gas props in accordance with NFPA 1402 will greatly enhance safety and operational readiness, reducing injuries of firefighters and civilians.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

FL State Statute 69A-37.060 Certification as an approved Firefighter Recruit Training Facility requires a liquefied petroleum gas firefighting field equipped with training props to provide training for automobile firefighting, pit fire training with floating fuel, and a 500 gallon LP tank to simulate a tank fire equipped with a shut off valve so students can approach the tank fire with a hose line and properly shut down the proper valves.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The intended purpose of the funding is to produce direct improved on scene operations in the mitigation of proane and gas fueled fires that occur within the city of North Lauderdale and surrouding jurisdictions. Training for all area first responders as it relates to fire/rescue operations. Training will be consistent with all National Standards and will provide a central location for surrounding emergency response agencies within Central Broward to train and work together. By funding this project, this facility will provide training for all propane LP gas emergencies types that occur within the city and surrounding jurisdictions.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Fire rescue personnel will be highly trained to mitigate any liquid petroleum gas fire incidents within the City of North Lauderdale (City) as well as surrounding cities. In addition, surrounding fire rescue agencies will receive this training as well.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

A better trained fire/rescue department will benefit not only all of the 47,000.00 residents of the City, but also the local businesses, parks and other establishments through a better trained fire rescue agency. Additionally, neighboring fire departments will be able to train at this facility and that will benefit their communities as well.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Better trained first responders, the potential for a better insurance ISO rating. Progress will be measured by comparing the amount of training sessions held per employee year to year as well as at the next ISO rating. In addition, by applying to be a state approved recruit training facility through the state appropriations funding, the City will provide a career track for youths that reside in the City and desire to establish a career as a firefighter. The addition of the liquefied petroleum gas field will secure the approval for a state of Florida fire recruit training facility. This will be a great accomplishment and benefit for the community and surrounding communities.
