14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Exterior restoration including replacement/repair of windows, door, fire escape, and masonry issues. This tower was the Jacksonville Fire Departments historic training facility. Built as a WPA project in the 1930s, and served as the primary training grounds for the fire service for 60 plus year. Closed in 1991, as a new training facility came on line it is currently owned by the Jacksonville Association of Fire Fighters. It is utilized as a supplemental training facility for the Jacksonville Fire Rescue Department (JFRD).

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Restoration specialist to rebuild the wooden windows and doors to original conditions. Repair/replace the fire escape to original condition, to allow its use for training, maintenance and roof access.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This facility acts as a supplemental training site for the Jacksonville Fire Rescue Department, as its central location is useful for some types of training scenarios. Thus allows units to remain closer to response areas during training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This tower was used by generation of Firefighters in the City of Jacksonville (City) for training and is often visited by firefighters visiting from outside the city. The JFRD still uses it from time to time for its ability to provide a 7-story training site. There are an average of about 30 visitors this month.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

To maintain its iconic history to fire service in Jacksonville, both in the public eye and as operationally useful to the JFRD, the restoration of the fire training tower is important to the City of Jacksonville, its residents, citizens and visitors.
