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Reducing unaccounted for water not only reduces operating cost (have to treat less water) but also extends the time period for increaing water supply and treatment capacity.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All of the BBWA water customers will benefit from this project. This includes the majority of residents of Steinhatchee in Taylor County and Jena in Dixie County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is an increase in operating pressure (particulary during fires) and a reduction in unaccounted for water. Before and after pressure readings at key fire hydrants along with before and after unaccounted for water can be calculated.
