Recreational Sports, sports tournaments, concerts, festivals and classes of all kinds, shows, farmers markets, trail systems, a veterans memorial, summer camps, shops, pathway to the beach, etc. are held and located on both sides of the highway in tandem. It will reduce jaywalking at this location and reduce the push button crosswalk usage at a nearby signalized intersection.
