Purchase, transport, deliver and place beach compatible sand from inland sand mines to fill scour holes, construct emergency berms, and restore eroded beach segments to offset impacts from Hurricane Ian. Dredge sand from offshore borrow area and transport, deliver and place beach compatible sand to construct emergency berm on North Segment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The current conditions of the beach are causing public health, safety and quality of life concerns. Residents and tourists will directly be services by having a nourished beach that is safe to enjoy.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Tourists and local citizens, and protected species. The nourishment of the beach will affect millions of people as tourism and residents return to the island.
