Conduct research to improve the efficiency of hydrogen liquefaction, since major transportation applications (such as aircraft) gain safety and endurance advantages by using tanks of LH2. Provide additional resiliency to households in the event of natural disasters and overall capacity constraints of aging electrical power grid.

Teach students, industry technicians, and professionals who will work in a hydrogen economy and give them hands on experience, and conduct research to improve the efficiency of hydrogen liquification, since major transportation applications (such as aircraft) gain safety and endurance advantages by using tanks of LH2.
