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Development of additional career and technical education programs for Polk County Public Schools focusing on the importance of agriculture, agriscience and agribusiness to Polk County and the State of Florida.

In addition to student educational services, 20% of produce grown will be donated to community organizations and students will also periodically conduct seed disbursements. Cattle and hunting leases will allow local citizens access to public lands.

Students in Kindergarten through 12th grade, adult students, citizens of Polk, DeSoto and Highlands counties. 20,000 individuals or above.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Quality education for students K through 12 in the importance of agriculture to Polk, DeSoto and Highlands counties and the State of Florida. Strengthening partnerships with the agriculture community and local citizens groups. Measurable outcomes will be developed by the lead agency (Florida Department of Education).
