Current statewide funding does not allow for capital improvements or sustainability diversification strategies and implementation.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Northwest Florida Area Agency on Aging is designated as the Aging and Disabilities Resource Center for Planning and Service Area 1 (PSA-1). The Northwest Florida Area Agency on Aging, Inc., Aging and Disability Resource Center is not a direct provider of health or social services but rather the administrative agency for PSA-1.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Agency collaborates with community-based service providers in the planning, coordination, development and evaluation of programs and services currently available for those residents who are 60 years old and older. The Aging and Disability Resource Center provides information and referral services to aging population as well as persons with developmental disabilities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Around 800 individuals are expected to be served through this project. These individuals are elderly persons, persons with poor physical health, economically disadvantaged persons, and physically disabled persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project is set to improve the sustainability of PSA-1's ADRC Facility, The Northwest Florida Area Agency on Aging. Ensuring the building is in safe, good working order. Post-Construction Inspection results will be submitted to Agency. New partners list and community partners plan may be submitted to the Agency.
