#### 14. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds will be used to expand a centralized data center that will facilitate the measuring and tracking of human trafficking incidents over time to determine the impact of different initiatives allowing for the use of evidence-based decision making and accountability in the use of state funds and programming.



#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project will provide statewide and regional reports on human trafficking incidents to inform anti-human trafficking initiatives allowing for the use of evidence-based decision making and accountability in the use of state funds and programming.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide reliable data to inform human trafficking prevention and intervention strategies which can be targeted based on data-driven information resulting in crime reduction and lower risk of exploitation in human trafficking for vulnerable populations. Using empirically-based programming, the project will enable the documentation of success in anti-trafficking efforts.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Persons with poor mental health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled, drug users (in health services). >800 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

A centralized data center facilitates the measuring and tracking of human trafficking over time to determine the impact of different initiatives for the use of evidence-based decision making and accountability in the use of funds and programming. Annual reports on the number of human trafficking incidents, victims, offenders, and regional hot spots in the state will allow the assessment of state-funded human trafficking initiatives.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
