a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of this project is to enhance the educational environment at the Devereux Florida Statewide Inpatient Psychiatric Program, to ensure children with significant emotional and behavioral disorders are provided with a classroom experience that is safe, and supportive of academic and therapeutic progress. The goal is construction of an education building dedicated to instructional activities, ensuring the safety and well-being of Florida's most vulnerable youth.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction and furnishing of an education building dedicated to instructional activities for children and adolescents (grades k-12) to include three classrooms, two restrooms, a multi-purpose room for learning and enrichment programs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funding for this project will ensure vulnerable youth from all areas of the state participating in a residential treatment program to address significant mental health needs are provided a safe environment for education services to be provided on-site, ensuring necessary resources to build the resiliency of all Floridians.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funding available through this request will serve at-risk children and adolescents, from all areas of the state, who experience poor mental health, economically disadvantaged, and some who have developmental disabilities and/or are victims of crime. The ages serviced are 5-18 years, grade school and high school students (grades K-12). Approximately 150-200 youth per year are served through this program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Construction of a building, dedicated to delivering educational instruction on-site will indicate outcome of intent for project request. In addition, impact to program and youth served will be evidenced by fewer disruptions to educational programming and school attendance.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Performance objectives and quantifiable measures are currently in place, any penalty measures are welcomed if metrics and objectives are not met.
