4. Project/Program Description

An international liberty plaza, welcome center and pathways will be constructed at the Dale Mabry Army Air Field Museum site on the campus of Tallahassee Community College as a reminder of America's global commitment to freedom and liberty exemplified in WWII. Dale Mabry AAF was a major fighter pilot combat training base where British, French, Chinese and other trained alongside our own, including the famed all-black "Tuskegee Airmen," 18,000 in total. The plaza will feature a grand display of the Stars and Stripes surrounded by flags of her WWII Allies, a thematic tribute to Florida's unparalleled support for Army Air Corps training in WWII; a circular drive with replicated guard station, 800 square foot welcome center, and scaled pathways replicating the base runways. This will be a must see attraction for regional, state, national and international tourists visiting Florida's Capital City and the heritage of our commitments on the home front and warfront during WWII.

Dale Mabry Army Air Field, Inc. is in partnership with Tallahassee Community College through a formal Memorandum of Understanding (2019) to establish an educational complex and museum on campus by 2024. TCC has provided the 5 acre museum site. We currently are recipients of a grant to relocate and restore a military housing structure built in 1941 by the federal government, which will be completed in 2024 for display to the public.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The addition of infrastructure and thematic enhancements to the attraction that will make it a "must see" cultural landmark for tourists to the Capital City of Florida. The liberty plaza will be attractive to freedom-loving people, and the international component adds cultural relevancy. The museum sits where the airbase once existed. WWII was a seminal moment in American and international history. The museum complex will transport visitors back to the 1940s to bring history alive and inspire the imaginations of younger generations in the areas of civic duty, military service, aviation, science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) through the stories of sacrifice and technological advancements made by America and it's "Greatest Generation" in its time of need, on the homefront and warfront. As a one-of-its kind educational and museum complex, it serves as an example of Florida's commitment to the war effort, particularly the development of air power--the deciding factor to victory.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Design and construction of the infrastructure and thematic enhancements as described in the project description, along with continued marketing and public relations of the amenity in conjunction with our community partners and stakeholders, including Tallahassee Community College. The design of the International Liberty Plaza and welcome center incorporates important themes conveying the heritage of America's contributions to the liberation of Europe and the commitment of citizens, particularly Floridians, to uniquely American ideals that stand in opposition to authoritarian forms of government. The welcome center will be the first stop for visitors, setting the tone for engagement in other museum assets.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The International Liberty Plaza and Welcome Center at Dale Mabry Army Air Field Museum is a cultural enhancement that improves the quality of life for the local community through education, entertainment and inspiration. It will reflect positively on the State of Florida, which played a major role in the war effort to liberate Europe from authoritarian rule. It will be a tourist attraction for visitors to the Capital City and provide educational opportunities in a multitude of areas including citizenship, civic pride, patriotism, Americanism versus Communism, and service through real stories of homefront and warfront events by Floridians using Dale Mabry Field and Tallahassee as exemplars for the many airbases that dotted Florida in that era.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Tourists and students of all ages. An economic study showing that 7% of tourists (approximately 118,000) to the Capital City visited historical amenities (Visit Tallahassee, 2020). Visit Florida affirms the value of military history and tourism by maintaining https://www.visitflorida.com/things-to-do/military/. Tallahassee is the 9th largest city in Florida and locally Tallahassee Community College has approximately 15,000 students alone and will open a K-12 charter school in 2023. Approximately 55,000 students attend Florida State University, Florida A&M University and Lively Technical College. Leon County K-12 enrollment is nearly 33,000 at 57 schools. A 2020 report by Visit Tallahassee indicated that 7% of tourists (118,000) visited historical amenities in the Capital City even though tourism was down 31% due to the COVID pandemic.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The International Liberty Plaza and Welcome Center at Dale Mabry Army Air Field Museum will contribute to "placemaking" strategy towards economic development. A major strategy of local government is "placemaking" leading to community identity, celebrated values and shared heritage, ultimately to make a community more desirable and prosperous and individuals choose a community to live, work and create businesses and jobs.* Tallahassee was a military town during WWII, Dale Mabry Army Air Field was a major airbase, and the efforts of the State to bring the Army Air Corps to Florida during WWII mobilization are untold chapters in our placemaking story book. *See https://www.talgov.com/place/pln-placemaking.
