Construction/Renovation/Land/ Planning Engineering	Construction funding is based upon competitive bidding the design to replace approximately 4,200 feet of existing 2-inch potable water mains and 3,900 feet of gravity sewer serving the Silver Spurs and Sunset Manor neighborhoods with 8-inch diameter water mains and fire hydrants and 8-inch gravity sewer. The project design will be completed by 04/30/2024 and construction initiated by 07/01/2025.	700,000

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Upgrading and replacing these potable water and wastewater mains is essential to maintaining public health and safety. The project will reduce service interruptions, the risk of contamination due to pipe breaks, improve service reliability and add fire protection to the neighborhoods. 4,200 ft of water mains with fire hydrants and 3,900 ft of sewer main will be installed. This is a vulnerable community with 23% of the residents age 65+, 26% with disabilities and 32% below the poverty level (Source- ESRI Business Analyst).

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Improved water pressure, service reliability and the addition of fire protection. Improved wastewater service reliability and reduced probability of wastewater spills.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are residents of Osceola County: 506 residents with 23% of the residents age 65+, 26% with disabilities and 32% below the poverty level (Source - ESRI Business Analyst).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will result in a reduction in the interruption of water and wastewater service to the communities due to water main breaks and sewer main breaks and/or blockages reducing the potential for contamination. Reduced wastewater spill exposure risk to virus and bacteria by a more reliable gravity sewer system. Fire protection will be added to the community with larger water mains and fire hydrants. The quality of life will be improved to the community residents. Maintenance of the existing mains, in some areas, may require residents to move structures, landscaping and possibly vacate homes during repairs due to the mains proximity to residential units and structures. The new mains will be installed in areas that will not impact existing structures. The outcome will be measured by the number of service interruptions per year as measured by work orders to repair broken water pipes and sewer main breaks and/or blockages to restore service.
