4. Project/Program Description

Design and construction of a new 4-way, signalized intersection on US 92 in the West International Speedway area of Daytona Beach. The new intersection in this increasingly strategic and highly trafficked area enables a material reduction of the design / posted speed which addresses the current and historic vehicle / pedestrian safety issues including numerous deaths and injuries. The improvements, including a new 4-way traffic signal w/ pedestrian crossing safety measures, lighting enhancements, pedestrian sidewalk extensions and roadway and drainage upgrades and modifications will provide increased safety and convenience to the range of city, county and state institutions located in the immediate vicinity (Tomoka Correctional Institution, Volusia Sheriff's Dept, Volusia County Fire Rescue Training Center, Beach House Youth Prevention, Volusia County Emergency Mgmt, Volusia County Vehicle Maintence, Volusia County Correctional Facility, Volusia County Medical Examiner...

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Increased safety and accessibility on US 92, where the new intersection will prepare the road to help accommodate a proposed intersection change and allow for traffic calming and pedestrian access on a stretch of highway where there have been several deaths (9) in the past few (5) years.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to construct a new lighted intersection on US92 allowing for reduction of design/posted speed in this area of US 92 (West International Speedway Blvd.) providing for and addressing a increasing level of vehicle/pedestrian safety and accessibility concerns. Improvements include a new 4-way traffic signal w/ pedestrian crossing safety measures, lighting improvements, pedestrian sidewalk extensions and roadway and drainage upgrades and modifications.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Increase safety on US92 and improve traffic flow with new intersection, increased pedestrian access and safety via extended sidewalks, crosswalks and lighting.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents and visitors of Volusia County as many core city, state and county service providers are located in the immediate vicinity, including the Tomoka Correctional Institution, Volusia Sheriff's Department, Volusia County Fire Rescue Training Center, Beach House Youth Prevention, Volusia County Emergency Management, Volusia County Vehicle Maintenance, Volusia County Correctional Facility, Volusia County Medical Examiner, First Step Homeless Shelter - as well as significant commercial employers including Manheim Daytona Beach and P&S Construction.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased safety on US 92, this can be measured based on the number of traffic accidents, including pedestrian strikes which occur on this stretch of the highway.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
