### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The specific purpose or goal of the program is to empower communities by providing comprehensive support services to survivors of gun violence, advocating for impactful policy changes, and promoting education and awareness about gun violence prevention. The program aims to create a safer future by supporting victims through counseling and legal assistance, empowering survivors to become advocates for change, engaging communities in dialogue and critical analysis of existing policies, promoting stricter control measures and improved background checks through advocacy efforts, and integrating age-appropriate curriculum modules in schools to foster critical thinking around gun violence prevention. Ultimately, the program strives to build a society free from gun violence.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Counseling and legal assistance to victims/survivors, Training and development for survivors and members to be able to advocate for policy changes to reduce gun violence (including stricter control measures and improved background checks). Promote community engagement and education through workshops, public forums, school programs, and awareness campaigns \$9500.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Victims/survivors will access counseling and legal aid, while survivors and members will receive training to advocate for policy changes that aim to decrease gun violence. We will also engage and educate the community through workshops, public forums, school programs, and awareness campaigns throughout the year.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our targeted population encompasses individuals across various demographics, transcending class, age, color, and any other distinguishing factors. We recognize that gun violence knows no bounds and thus our focus extends to anyone who has been impacted in some capacity. This includes but is not limited to the following categories: elderly persons, individuals with poor mental or physical health, those who are unemployed or economically disadvantaged, at-risk youth, the homeless community, individuals with developmental or physical disabilities, as well as drug users receiving health services. Additionally, we provide support for preschool students through university/college students, including those who have been currently or formerly incarcerated or labeled as drug offenders within the criminal justice system. Our efforts also extend to victims of crime who require assistance and rehabilitation. Our goal is to raise awareness and provide our services to over 600 people in Miami Dade.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project aims to raise awareness about gun violence and provide support services. The expected outcomes will be measured using the following metrics:

- 1. Number of people reached: Services will be provided to over 600 individuals in Miami Dade County.
- 2. Awareness levels: A survey or assessment will gauge the level of awareness before and after the project.
- 3. Client satisfaction: Feedback from individuals who received support will be collected through surveys or interviews.
- 4. Reduction in gun violence incidents: Tracking any decrease in gun violence incidents within the targeted population over time
- 5. Collaboration with partner organizations: Establishing partnerships with other organizations working towards similar goals.

These measurement methods evaluate the effectiveness of raising awareness and providing support services to individuals impacted by gun violence.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
