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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Vision for Florida Girl's Initiative (FGI) is to become a state-funded initiative that provides resources for communities across Florida to address critical issues impacting the lives of at-promise girls aging out of foster care and girls who are at risk of trafficking. Our goal is to develop a proven, replicable blueprint that addresses critical issues impacting the lives of at-promise girls ages birth to 21 years of age.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Family stabilization resources; individual, group and family therapy; financial literacy; planning and training; life skills training and support, educational support and referrals, and substance abuse education and treatment referrals. Activities also include financial support to agencies, families, and individuals.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services include financial supports; family stabilization services; individual, group and family therapy; and financial literacy, planning and training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target populations to be served are jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, grade school students, high school students, university/college students, currently or formerly incarcerated persons and victims of crime. The number of individuals expected to be served is over 800.
