14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds being requested is to cover the remaining unfunded liability for the rebuild of Sanibel Fire Station 172 (Station). This station suffered devastating damage from Hurricane Ian, with 5-6 feet of storm surge leading to substantial impairment. Rebuilding station 172 will provide emergency services to the community and tourists with swift response times to fire and medical emergencies.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



The upgraded station will allow Sanibel Fire and Rescue District (District) personnel to provide enhanced emergency medical and fire protection. This includes fire and life safety, education, prevention and training activities through open houses, course offerings and formal trainings. All of these activities would be available to community members as well as specialized education and training programs for District staff.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Enhanced emergency response (fire and rescue): with a reconstructed station 172, citizens can expect faster and more efficient responses to emergencies, minimizing potential hazards and damages. EMS: the station will be primed to offer Emergency Medical Services (EMS), which ensures that in the case of medical emergencies there is adequate essential supplies and trained medical responders.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The District services nearly 7,000 full time residents that reside within the District boundary. This number increases to nearly 40,000 when tourists are visiting the area.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The expected benefits are improvement in physical health; improvement in mental health; improvement in quality of education; protection of the general public from harm (environmental, criminal, etc.). The new fire station will be constructed to meet all current standards and recommendations by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). NFPA standard 1500 is the standard on Fire Department Occupational Safety, Health and Wellness Program, and it impacts fire station design in areas including cancer prevention, fitness and mental health.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the District fails to construct the new station, the District will repay the funds. Due to the uncertainty surrounding funding from FEMA related to the reconstruction of fire station 27, which the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) hurricane recovery grant program required to be deducted from any awarded funds, the District will ensure that no excess state funds will be used and this can be provided for in the agency contract.
