a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose is to integrate modern agricultural practices and technologies into the grades 6-12 curriculum, providing students with hands-on learning experiences. The program includes elements such as a full grades 6-12 curriculum, access to master horticulturists, the latest growing tools, and easy-to-use data dashboards. The overall goal is to educate the next generation of agricultural innovators, merging traditional education with hands-on project-based, data-driven agricultural practices.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Project-based learning [PBL] tools will be provided to cater to a wide diversity of students throughout the Tampa Bay area. Contracted services will be used to refine features, ensuring adaptive content and tools while consultants will prioritize gathering educator feedback, on-going tech support, and refinements to UI/UX. The funds will also be channeled to support specialized training initiatives and consistent on-site assistance, aiming to promote teacher retention and student academic support.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Project-based learning [PBL] initiatives centered around agriculture and gardening will benefit all participating students in Tampa Bay 6-12 schools, particularly addressing the specific needs of ELL, ESE, gifted, and economically disadvantaged students. Teachers will benefit from specialized training and continuous support, enhancing their ability to provide personalized instruction.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Grades 6-12 Students in the Tampa Bay Area, 800+ served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

By harnessing advanced algorithms, personalized learning pathways are enhanced and reinforced, catering especially to ELL, ESE, and Gifted students. This tailored approach boosts student comprehension and engagement. Anticipated measurable outcomes include improved standardized test performance and increased teacher retention, attributed to enriched instructional methods. Evaluation will center around daily student data insights provided to teachers, enabling real-time tracking of student growth and comprehension. Yearly comparisons of standardized test performance will further quantify academic improvements. Teacher retention rates will be analyzed annually, linked with their engagement in training and tools.
