Complete renovations started on current indoor gym by replacing old windows with paned-insulated glass for better air quality and improving lifespan on HVAC system recently replaced.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Improve services to Prekindergarten students through updated facilities to maximize use of time and increase the usability of buildings.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Funds will be used to complete renovations the gym that just received HVAC renovations from ARP funds. Windows that were not eligible for ARP renovations need replacing. Renovate an existing building closer to student classrooms for the cafeteria. Demolish cafeteria that is 70+ years old and is too costly to renovate.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improve the quality of facilities to the next 35+ years of Prekindergarten students for the Jackson County School District. The students attending school there this year will send their kids to these facilities in 20-30 years.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Improve services to 200 Prekindergarten students and their families annually for at least the next 35+ years.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Current barrier for the cafeteria is a 7-10 minute walk each way for the students. New location would cut walk time to 3 minutes increasing educational seat time by 14 minutes per day. Current cafeteria is three times the size the current program needs for operation. Reduction in operational costs will be realized annually.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

No additional penalties outside of the standard AIA contract.
