14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Refurbishment of a historic draw bridge (1 of 2 in the state) necessary to maintain access to the historic Cove neighborhood. Refurbishment to include, but not limited to, structural and mechanical improvements. Additionally, the waterline that supplies critical fire flow to the historic Cove neighborhood currently sits on the surface of the seabed directly under the draw bridge. This leaves the line exposed in a maritime traffic lane under the bridge and is counter to best practices.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Refurbishment activities to include, but not limited to, structural, mechanical, signalization, and general safety improvements. Water line replacement to include directional boring, maintenance of traffic, and other related activities. US Corp of Engineers waterline permitting underway.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Refurbishment of the draw bridge will allow for continued access on the west side of the Cove neighborhood while maintaining maritime traffic into Massalina Bayou for recreation boaters and marinas. The waterline replacement will increase the resiliency of a potable water distribution system for critical life safety for fire flow. US Corp of Engineers waterline permitting underway.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

City residents in the Cove neighborhood as well commercial and recreational boaters in Massalina Bayou.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Protecting the public from harm by ensuring the waterline used for fire flow is protected to ensure life safety. Waterline replacement will also increase the resiliency of the city potable water distribution system. This will be measured by pressure residuals and fire flow testing reports. This will improve drinking water quality by improving chlorine residuals due to restoration of looped water. This will be measured by water quality testing. Improved traffic conditions that will come from refurbishing the draw bridge to ensure continued access to the neighborhood while maintaining maritime access. This will be measured by traffic studies and surveys.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
