14. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds requested will go towards an expansion of the current JA pre-apprenticeship program in Broward and launch the Lee and Collier counties' program. This includes adding a telecom/broadband track and expanding the current marine, yacht and construction tracks. These programs will address the workforce demands employers are experiencing in all three counties. JASF and JASWFL will be the only JA organizations in the country providing this program to upper high school students and young adults.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

JA is committed to empowering every young person with the skills, knowledge, and confidence to navigate their futures, be work ready and drive our local economy. This will be achieved by providing services and activities that include workforce training, career exploration, OSHEA certification, employment and pre-apprenticeship to high school seniors and other youth.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

JA Initiatives focus on career exploration, skills training, job shadowing, entrepreneurship and pre-apprenticeship. These programs are proven ways to get high school students interested and engaged in careers across industries, teach valuable work skills and provide direct opportunities with students to connect with local businesses and employment opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Targeted populaitons are economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, high school students, and any students/young adults ages 17-24. Thr project is expected to serve 201-400 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefits of the project include improved quality of education, increased or improved economic activity, and the enhancement of specific individual's economic self-sufficiency. The program will increase the level of essential workforce skills that students need to be ready for the workforce. It will also develop qualified entry level job candidates for employers in industries with workforce shortages. These will be measured through surveys of participants, pre and post-tests and tracking of both completion of program, industry certifications earned by students resulting from program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Based on the fact that this is a program extension into the telecom / broadband industry (in addition to the current marine and construction workforce programs) we would recommend that the time period for which to deliver the performance measures would be extended if that will allow completion. Of the allocation, 263,145 are for Collier and Lee County; any state funds not utilized in these counties shall be reimbursed.
