a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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The launch of a pilot workforce advancement program for adults with autism in the mobile device and repairs and services industry. The program will integrate individualized training, coaching, peer mentoring, and supports across a spectrum of needs; and also include employer training in hiring, leading, and managing individuals with autism. Individuals will earn opportunities for industry certification and related skills that can lead to employment, greater independence, dignity and purpose.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Planning, development, and launch of a pilot workforce advancement program for adults with autism in the high-tech sector of cellphone and tablet repair and disposition. Employer training in the employment of adults with autism and other IDD.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Individualized skills training, coaching, and peer mentoring. Specific skills include fine motor skills, problem solving and critical thinking, communications and teamwork, and time management. As a result, the individuals served will gain enhanced employability, career growth, and the opportunity to be an integral part of a skilled workforce.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Jobless persons, developmentally disabled persons, and persons with Autism Spectrum Diagnosis. Upwards of 100 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The program will provide an enriched cultural experience, improve the quality of education and enhance a specific individual's economic self-sufficiency. Measured successes and outcomes will derive from employer partnership surveys and feedback sessions. Improvements to the quality of education will be measured through participant outcomes such as gaining transferable job skills, earning industry recognized certifications, obtaining internships and training milestones that result in greater job readiness and successful placement. Enhancing economic self-sufficiency will be measured by tracking job readiness at multiple intervals of the training and certification process as well as gainful job placement.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Corrective action plans and/or financial consequences will be required for non-compliance, non-performance, or failure to achieve the minimum level of services or performance under the contract.
