a. What is the current phase of the project?

Design

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The total amount of federal assistance received during the COVID-19 pandemic is \$981,617.62. The museum received \$617,253.62 (Cares Act Payment Protection Program), and \$364,000.00 (Employee Retention Credit / CAA + Cares Act). The funding was used primarily to enable the museum to retain existing staff as a result of the added COVID-related expenses and lost revenue resulting from the pandemic.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The funds from the state will ensure the project will bring an iconic, innovative museum to the Shipyards of Jacksonville, a hub for culture and entertainment, and ensure there will be uninterrupted progress in planning, engineering, development, and construction. These funds will specifically move the project into the final design and construction phase.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support the design, engineering, development, and construction of the new MOSH facility.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

MOSH will enhance the Northbank of Downtown Jacksonville by creating public gathering spaces for lifelong learning and experiential education; deliver immersive digital experiences and learning that will shape twenty-first century job skills for tomorrow's workforce; showcase dynamic platforms to engage students, families, and adults; and dedicate space for early STEAM learning.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All residents and visitors in the City of Jacksonville will be served; specifically, programs will be targeted to K-12 students, higher education institutions, economically disadvantaged, elderly and physically disabled individuals. MOSH currently serves approximately 200,000 visitors a year, with the Genesis Project, CounsultEcon estimates 500,000 visitors would be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

By building a new facility, MOSH will have the opportunity to enrich the cultural experience in Jacksonville by hosting numerous events throughout the year. MOSH will be able to enhance the quality of education for students in northeast Florida by hosting additional field trip opportunities and learning experiences. According to the ConsultEcon studies, the MOSH Genesis project will not only have a one-time, immediate economic impact through construction and peripheral work, but will serve to increase tourism to the community and expand the employment base. The current estimated one-time construction impact is \$130 million, with a \$226 million Extended Positive Economic Impact, which can be confirmed with an economic impact study and staying engaged with VISIT Jacksonville on their tourism numbers. Additionally, the construction project, as well as the ongoing operation of the museum, will create an estimated \$2.3 million in new salaries and wages, as well as 100 jobs.
