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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funding to provide much needed renovation of the Charlotte Campus Building E that would allow for incremental increases in program enrollment, with initial efforts focused on increasing day program enrollment from 24 to 36 students, then increasing evening/weekend program enrollment from 18 to 24 students, followed by the addition of an additional day program cohort of 24 to 36 students. As a result, total Charlotte campus ASN program enrollment would increase from 84 to over 192 students over a 2-3 year period. Subsequently, projected completers of the program will be increased by over 50% as a result of facility renovation. As for the implementation of the two new PTA and AMA Associate of Science degrees, the programs are expected to enroll 25 (for PTA) and upwards of 60 (for AMA & CCC) each year.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A successful and efficient simulation learning environment within Building E of FSW's Charlotte campus would allow for the ASN program to increase program enrollment by maximizing on the ability to provide simulated clinical training experiences for up to 50% of program clinical training hours. Needed renovation of Building E includes creating a variety of rooms for training purposes including control monitor stations, patient suites, debriefing rooms, and adjacent classroom spaces. The renovated space would include use of drop ceilings, simulated air, gas, and suction, hospital and community setting furnishings, and state of the art technology including audiovisual equipment, networking, computers, and software.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed renovation would improve academic experiences by providing ASN students, faculty, and staff effective and efficient space to receive and provide effective learning experiences. Funding for renovation of Building E would provide Charlotte campus students access to state-of-the-art technology and learning spaces aligned with those currently available to FSW ASN students on the Lee and Collier campuses. The redesign of Building E would also create a Charlotte Campus Simulation Center that will allow for full 50% utilization of customized evidenced-based training for a safer healthcare system, increasing enrollment, and improving recruitment opportunities for nursing graduates. Additionally, the renovation would benefit multiple health professions programs at FSW as this space would provide a real-time training facility for interdisciplinary patient care experiences.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Projected increases in day program enrollment from 24 to 36 students, evening/weekend program enrollment from 18 to 24 students, an additional day program cohort of 24 to 36 students. As for the implementation of the two new PTA and AMA Associate of Science degrees, the programs are expected to enroll 25 (for PTA) and upwards of 60 (for AMA & CCC) each year. Utilization by community and clinical partners, and other health professions programs would be facilitated during times of availability when this space is not in use for the ASN program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

A local and national nursing shortage continues to exist, and multiple vacant Registered Nursing positions are available for our ASN graduates, not only in Charlotte County but across Southwest Florida. Clinical partners and employers of our graduates have expressed dire need for us to provide as many qualified and skilled graduates as possible, to assist them in meeting their workforce needs and in decreasing the number of traveling nurse positions they are forced to fill given progressive and ongoing RN position vacancies. Upon completion of Building E renovation on the Charlotte campus, FSW's ASN Program will be positioned to better assist in meeting the economic need for increased RN workforce and help to narrow the gap between available academic program seats and vacant nursing positions.
