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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ensure every Gator receives reasonable accommodations to access all educational programs, facilities and activities associated with our excellent student experience. Our campus has a need for a new Disability Resource Center (DRC). We have three identified needs: accommodated testing has grown over the years (over 14,000 in FY23); academic testing (assembly exams, exams required for graduation); and a need for access to testing for the campus and community (GRE, MCAT, NCLEX). UF feels that it is more strategic and causes less disruption to look at this unique opportunity to combine this with the new DRC.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The new Disability Resource Center and testing center would be approximately 31,700 GSF of the shared building and would include low distraction spaces; separate testing environments; space for offices, study space, lockers and engagement environments. UF has determined that there is an economy of scale to plan a new testing center in conjunction with the DRC.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In addition to student testing services, the general public will have a location to take important standardized tests such as the GRE, MCAT or NCLEX.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is students requiring accommodations during testing, general students, and the public, and the project expects thousands of test takers annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Success will be determined by number of students receiving accommodations in their testing, general testing for students, and number of community members who take standardized tests.
