4. Project/Program Description

The National Association of Veterans and Families (NAVF) is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization founded in 2008. The first part of our mission is to educate the veteran community on their wartime & other benefits. The second part is keeping our veterans off the street, in a protected environment, by assisting qualifying senior veterans, their spouses, and widows in obtaining their promised Wartime VA Benefits (from WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and Gulf Era Wars to-the-present. We provide all of our services at no charge to the veteran. Last year we had over 120 workshops in Florida. We filed over 1200 claims and recovered over \$36,000,000 in benefits for the veteran and family members. Over a three-year period, equating to \$108,000,000 in Medicaid savings to the state. NAVF takes great care in filing claims with a 98% success rate. Our funding comes from our corporate community and from individuals.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will be used to help Veterans who need assistance obtaining benefits for the VA Pensions Plus Aid & Attendance program, the VA Directed Care program and other little-known programs. Without these VA benefits, many veterans, spouses & widows are forced to go on FL's Medicaid program or even worse become homeless.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

First of all is to educate the veteran community through seminars, either in-person or by zoom. Further, serving senior veterans and spouses/widows in need of additional VA benefits. We help them navigate a process that can be difficult and confusing. NAVF's unique team approach & expertise evaluates each Veteran's information & eligibility; we assist them in securing required documentation such as military service records, medical documentation & signatures needed to prepare each Veteran's fully developed and Documented VA Claim–each claim averaging 50-60 pages in length. If the VA has claim questions/issues, NAVF works to solve the problem. All without charging them.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services consist of phone, in person, and zoom calls with adult children of the senior veteran/spouse. This is especially important as we currently see 7 to 10 dementia cases a day. These veterans are unable to navigate the system and many times children reside in another state. NAVF's unique team approach & expertise evaluates each Veteran's information & eligibility. We assist them in securing required documentation such as military service records, medical documentation & signatures needed to prepare each Veteran's Fully-developed and Documented VA Claim-each claim averaging 50-60 pages in length. If the VA has claim questions/issues, NAVF works to solve the problem. All without charging them.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida currently has the 3rd largest population of any state with a large number of veterans moving to Florida. Based on our current data, we predict over 20,000 phone calls, 200 seminars, 2,000 claims, and 1,500 claim approvals. That will produce over 37 million in benefits annually for the veterans costs of care. That will reduce Medicaid claims for the state.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit to the veteran and/or spouse is that they have the additional funds to choose the level of care that they require without having to go to a nursing home and rely on Medicaid. The VA money is federal money-not Florida state money.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
