The State College of Florida Collegiate School is a tuition-free public charter high school, sponsored by Sarasota County Schools. The charters are a division of the State College of Florida, Manatee-Sarasota and offer accelerated dual enrollment allowing students to graduate with their high school diploma and associate in arts degree in the same week.

Local high school students, grades 9-12, up to 400 students.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

In partnership with SCF, collegiate students gain access to a unique dual enrollment program that enables them to earn an associate in arts degree simultaneously with their high school diploma. Additionally, SCFCSV has articulation agreements with New College and FGCU to offer our graduates scholarships for another three years of tuition at local institutions. Measures include grade progression, test scores, graduation rates and participation and recognition in extracurricular activities, as well as acceptance into state universities.
