### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will support the completion of Phase 2 of the Sanford Courtyard project, adding 10 permanent, affordable apartments to address Seminole County's critical shortage of housing for low-income individuals and families experiencing homelessness. This initiative aims to provide stable housing and access to resources that foster economic self-sufficiency and personal growth.



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### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will cover essential construction costs, including utility hookups, site preparations, and final work required to complete the 10 units. Additionally, residents will benefit from support services provided through partnerships, such as financial literacy workshops, job training, and other programs delivered in an on-site community room.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide permanent, affordable housing to low-income individuals or families. Residents will also have access to community-based support services, including financial literacy, job readiness training, and educational opportunities through partnerships with local organizations like Habitat for Humanity and Seminole State College.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will serve low-income individuals and families experiencing homelessness or severe housing instability, including veterans, families with children, and individuals in the A.L.I.C.E. (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) population. It is expected to directly house and serve 10 households, benefiting approximately 20-40 individuals, depending on family size.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduce Homelessness, measured by the annual Point-in-Time (PIT) count to track unsheltered persons. Compare preand post-construction PIT data. Improve Economic Self-Sufficiency, measured by tracking participation and outcomes in financial literacy and job training programs. Monitor participation in partner provided programs and surveys to assess progress. Enhance Community Stability, evaluated through resident retention rates and increased housing stability reports. Feedback on housing retention and satisfaction.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Withholding a portion of the allocated funds until construction milestones or occupancy goals are met. Requiring additional progress reports or audits to ensure compliance with deliverables. Acknowledging that CFHG is currently part of the Restrictive Use Covenant (REC) for Seminole County for 30 years, ensuring that the property remains designated for its intended purpose. Penalties for failing to meet deliverables may include measures to safeguard compliance.
