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13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Expand NAVF's outreach and assistance programs to ensure Florida's growing senior veteran population secures VA Pension Plus Aid & Attendance benefits. By hosting educational seminars and providing expert guidance through the complex application process, NAVF will help veterans access safe care, avoid Medicaid reliance and homelessness, and reduce burdens on families and state resources.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In 2025, NAVF will host 50 educational seminars across Florida to inform senior Veteran communities about their VA benefits. NAVF will provide 130 one-on-one counseling sessions to guide veterans & their families through the process. Leveraging its expertise, NAVF helps veterans navigate complex VA Pension Plus Aid & Attendance applications, ensuring Sr. Veterans receive the financial support for assisted living & other protected care facilities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

NAVF educates veterans through in-person and Zoom seminars while helping senior veterans and spouses secure VA benefits. Our experts assess eligibility, gather documentation, and prepare detailed VA claims—50-60 pages each—at no cost. If issues arise, we work directly with the VA. With Florida's growing veteran population, we plan to host 50 seminars, hold 130 counseling sessions, handle 4,000+ calls, and submit completed claims.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida has 719,000 senior veterans, with 31,000 more relocating annually. This vital assistance helps eligible veterans secure financial support, access safe care resources, and receive dignified support that enhances their quality of life while conserving state resources.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit to the veteran or spouse is the ability to access additional funds to select the level of care they require, without the need for a nursing home or reliance on Medicaid. This funding comes from the federal government, not from Florida state resources. It is a win-win for the state, the veteran, and the qualified wartime veterans who are promised these benefits by the federal government for their service.
