4. Project/Program Description

The Lauderdale Lakes Drainage Improvements Project aims to enhance drainage service delivery and waterflow into the South Florida Water Management District C-12 and C-13 Canals. The city's interconnected canals and culverts play a vital role in keeping hydraulic balance. Improvements will control surface water runof, transportation conditions on roadways, protect the environment, enhance discharge into SFWMD primary canal, and improve groundwater quality. These upgrades will reduce flooding duration, accelerate stormwater conveyance to public waterways, and ensure steady stormwater flow through the city canals into C-12 and C-13.

Public Safety improvement; 2. Water Quality improvements; 3. Enhanced compliance with NPDES permit with FDEP; 4. Increase of pavement surface service lifetime; 5. Alleviation of flooding issues

The project scope include installation of new drainage system and also the repair and/or replacement of the roadway drainage system, culverts, outfalls and swales improvements throughout the City of Lauderdale Lakes.

The project will minimize the risk of flooding in residential and commercial areas, ensuring the safety and well-being of citizens during heavy rainfall events. The project will contribute to better water quality by reducing pollutants and mitigating the impact of stormwater runoff. The repair and maintenance of existing culverts, outfalls, and swales, along with the installation of new drainage systems, will strengthen the city's infrastructure, making it more resilient. The improvements to roadway drainage systems will reduce standing water on streets.

About Ten thousand people are expected to be served with this project.

Roadway flooding issues in the critical areas will be resolved. It will help residents mobility and will also enhance traffic safety.
