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The funding will replace damaged portable buildings with a 10,000 sq. ft. permanent Youth Development Center, ensuring a safe, storm-resistant space for childcare, before and after school programs, and community meals. A full-service kitchen will address food security needs. Additionally, playground fencing and equipment will be upgraded with durable, storm-resistant materials to enhance safety and longevity, creating a secure, engaging environment for youth and families.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Youth Development Center will provide childcare, before and after school programs, academic support, and youth activities in a safe, storm-resistant space. A full-service kitchen will offer nutritious meals for children and the community. The upgraded playground will ensure safe, engaging outdoor play. These services support youth development, education, and community well-being.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funding will provide safe childcare, before and after school programs, academic support, and youth activities. A full-service kitchen will offer daily meals for children and community members. The upgraded playground will provide a secure space for outdoor play. These services enhance education, nutrition, and well-being for families in a storm-resilient facility.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes at-risk youth, grade school students, and families in Charlotte County and surrounding areas. The project is expected to serve 500+ individuals, providing childcare, after-school programs, academic support, and youth activities in a safe, storm-resistant facility.

The project will improve education, physical health, and community resilience by providing academic support, safe play areas, and a storm-resistant facility.
