The project is expected to reduce flooding incidents by 50% in the 24th and 25th Streets area, extend road lifespan by 20 years through improved drainage and resurfacing, and enhance water quality by reducing pollutants entering local waterways. In addition, the project is expected to improve transportation safety and accessibility by reducing roadway flooding incidents by 50%, enhancing pavement conditions to meet safety standards, and increasing road durability, reducing the need for frequent maintenance over the next 20 years.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds for the 24th and 25th Streets Stormwater Improvements and Road Resurfacing Project will support hiring consultants, contracting services, conducting studies, and performing fieldwork to ensure effective project management. These efforts will deliver benefits such as improved drainage, reduced flooding, and enhanced road safety. Construction costs will cover upgraded stormwater infrastructure, erosion control, landscaping restoration, and resurfacing to improve conditions, ensure efficient water runoff, and promote sustainability.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project is expected to reduce flooding incidents by 50% in the 24th and 25th Streets area, extend road lifespan by 20 years through improved drainage and resurfacing, and enhance water quality by reducing pollutants entering local waterways.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Directly, more than 625 residents of the Lakeview Park Community; indirectly, over 38,000 residents and visitors of the City of Riviera Beach, Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project is expected to reduce flooding incidents by 50% in the 24th and 25th Streets area, extend road lifespan by 20 years through improved drainage and resurfacing, and enhance water quality by reducing pollutants entering local waterways.
