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The requested funds will be used to upgrade Liberty County's radio equipment to meet the requirements of the P25-compliant SLERS 2 system. This upgrade will ensure compliance with statewide standards and allow all Liberty County first responders, including Fire, EMS, and the Sheriff's Office, to communicate on a unified network. By enhancing interoperability, the upgrade will improve coordination among local, state, and federal emergency agencies, leading to more efficient response efforts and increased public safety. The upgraded system will bolster first responder safety and enhance mutual aid support to neighboring areas.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Enhanced, secure, reliable radio communication services to ensure first responders are able to quickly and accurately provide emergency response services to the county and to provide mutual aid to surrounding areas.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services provided to citizens are the improvement of communications for all users providing greater interoperability and safety for first responders, as well as reducing emergency response times, injuries, fatalities, and property damage.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project would be the citizens of Liberty County that would benefit from the improvement and increased efficiency between agencies that provide emergency response at the local level.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits of this project include improvements to public physical health and mental health through faster response times to emergencies and mental health crises, improved education quality through communication at educational facilities, improved transportation conditions by providing more efficient response to traffic incidents, and an improvement of communication between law enforcement and state fish and wildlife officers during crises that fall under jurisdiction of law enforcement with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC). All outcomes can be measured through the use of DATA from the Liberty County Sheriff's Dispatch Computer Aided Dispatch (C.A.D.) System.
