4. Project/Program Description

The specific goal of this project is to improve public and officer safety, increase transparency and accountability, and enhance the quality of evidence collected during law enforcement encounters by equipping officers with body-worn cameras, in-car video systems, and less lethal electronic control devices. Our police officers currently do not have bodyworn cameras, their electronic control devices are 10 to 14 years old, and their in-car cameras have an average age of 7 years old. The requested items link together to capture data which is then electronically transferred directly to the state attorney's office in a timely manner rather than transferring evidence via DVD like our officers are currently doing. Currently, our State Attorney's office only accepts electronic evidence via Evidence.com or DVD. The requested funding would give our police access to Evidence.com. This will increase the number of successfully prosecuted criminal cases that originated in the City.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific goal is to improve public and officer safety, increase transparency and accountability, and enhance the quality of evidence collected during law enforcement encounters by equipping officers with body-worn cameras, in-car video systems, and less lethal electronic control devices. This will allow for timely transfer of data to the State Attorney's office which will assist in the successful prosecution of criminal cases that originated in the City of Satellite Beach.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support the purchase, training, deployment, and ongoing management of the body-worn cameras, in car-cameras, and electronic control devices. The funds will provide our law enforcement officers with tools to enhance public safety, increase transparency and accountability, improve evidence collection, and improve the delivery of evidence to the state attorney's office.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services provided to citizens will be increased safety during encounters, unbiased video evidence to support complaints or court cases, protection of individual rights, and greater confidence in the fairness and accountability of law enforcement.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is anyone who comes in contact with law enforcement in the City of Satellite Beach. This ranges from elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, drug users, students of all ages, currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders, and victims of crime. We expect the number individuals served per year will be greater than 800.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits and outcomes of this project are a reduction in injuries to subjects officers have arrested, a reduction in injury reports to our officers, an increase in positive interactions with our law enforcement officers, an observation of an increase of evidence being delivered to the State Attorney's office in a timely manner. These outcomes can be measured through the observation of law enforcement report data, in-car and body worn camera data, and an increase in successfully prosecuted criminal cases originating in the City of Satellite Beach.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Should the City of Satellite Beach not utilize the funding allocated by the State of Florida to fund and meet the deliverables of the project, the City of Satellite Beach will be required to return the funding to the State of Florida.
