13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

BSI is seeking support to renovate its facility as a one-of-a-kind community offering. BSI provides comprehensive wraparound services that strengthens children and families by promoting self-sufficiency and healthy relationship courses. Headquartered in the heart of South Dade for over 30 years, BSI's existing facility structure does not meet the demand of the 11,000 families served yearly. This initiative will empower Be Strong Village to provide integrated, family strengthening services to families.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The facility will empower families, strengthen relationships, and promote long-term family stability. Ultimately, BSI desires to reduce the risk of child abuse, neglect, and family disruption.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Families will be able to access family-strengthening services such as complimentary parenting education & marriage courses and support through evidence-based and evidence informed strategies, youth development services, case management and care coordination services, and support to help families build safe and stable environments.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Families, single parents and married parents with poor mental/physical health, at risk youth, homeless but employed families, grade school students, high school students, and university/college students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Be Strong Village will serve as a safe haven with community benefit measured by: 1) Centralizing services for 11,000 families annually measured by client intake and enrollment assessments; 2) Improving access to parenting skills, healthy marriage courses, fatherhood courses, youth development services, and family engagement opportunities as measured by parenting skills surveys and family engagement surveys; and 3) Improved access to care coordination that links heads of households to resources as managed by BSI's data management system.
