4. Project/Program Description

Autism is affecting more of Florida's families than ever before: Today, 1 in 31 children in the U.S. is diagnosed, up from 1 in 150 in 2000. Meanwhile, 85% of autistic adults are unemployed or underemployed. The Bridge to Success (B2S) Program, created by the Boca School for Autism (BSA), provides year-round vocational training and workshops for young adults with autism, through the creation of micro-enterprises. Participants gain skills in product design, customer service, sales, money management, workplace behavior, and self-advocacy, all bolstered by instructors, job coaches, and autism therapy supports. Program funds will also be utilized for transportation to and from on-site job training in the community, with measurable data-driven outcomes that advance independence and employability. BSA is a an award winning institution, co-located in the FAU Research Park, where educators and clinicians work side by side to deliver lifechanging outcomes for students.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

If awarded, this appropriation will expand the Bridge to Success (B2S) Program at the Boca School for Autism, following a successful pilot. The goal of B2S is to provide year-round vocational training, workshops, entrepreneurship opportunities, and employment pathways for young adults with autism; increase independence; reduce reliance on state services; strengthen Florida's workforce.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The B2S Program will provide vocational training through the creation micro-enterprises in sectors such as food & beverage and hospitality, where participants learn product development, customer service, sales, and financial literacy. The program will also support transportation to job sites, on-the-job training with local employers, workplace coaching, self-advocacy instruction, and specialized entrepreneurship training; program evaluation will track skills gained, employment outcomes, and independence measures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The B2S Program will provide autistic young adults with direct vocational instruction, workshops, job coaching, and workplace readiness training through micro-enterprises and community job placements. Participants will receive hands-on experience, daily coaching, and supported employment opportunities that build independence and prepare them for competitive work.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Autism is effecting more of Florida's families than ever before: Today, 1 in 31 children in the United States is diagnosed, up from 1 in 150 in 2000. Meanwhile, 85% of autistic adults are unemployed or underemployed. The target population of the B2S program at the Boca School for Autism is young adults with autism in Palm Beach County and the surrounding areas. Following a successful pilot, the expanded B2S program, if funded, will initially serve 35+ students/year, with the capacity and expectation to scale and expand rapidly in future years. Boca School for Autism and the B2S program is incredibly well-supported in the community. Beyond receiving direct financial support from the City of Boca Raton and the Community Foundation of Palm Beach and Martin Counties, there are letters of support for BSA from multiple Palm Beach County School Board members and other elected officials, and community leaders.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will increase employment and independence for autistic young adults by providing year-round vocational training and on-site experience. At least 80% of participants will show measurable gains in workplace readiness, and 50% or more will obtain employment, self-employment, or paid work experience within their first year of program participation. Outcomes will be measured through skill assessments, employment tracking, micro-enterprise revenue, and annual reporting on independence gains.
