### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Fire Station Alerting System Upgrade will replace outdated alerting infrastructure with a modern, network-based solution to improve emergency response times, enhance firefighter safety, and increase reliability of dispatch notifications. The project will install redundant systems, visual and auditory alerting, and station automation to ensure rapid turnout.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The requested funds will be used to purchase, install, and implement a modern fire station alerting system that integrates with regional dispatch. This project will provide faster and more reliable emergency notifications through upgraded speakers, visual strobes, message boards, and station automation. The system will be configured, tested, and maintained to ensure 99.9% uptime, while firefighters and dispatchers will receive full training to ensure effective use. These activities will reduce emergency response times, improve firefighter safety, and enhance service delivery to the community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project directly benefits the community by reducing emergency response times, which can make a life-saving difference during fires, medical emergencies, and other critical incidents. Faster and more reliable alerting improves the safety of firefighters, ensuring they are better prepared to serve residents. The upgraded system will enhance protection within the department's jurisdiction, while also strengthening mutual aid support for surrounding communities. By modernizing this essential infrastructure, the project increases public safety, supports regional emergency response, and provides long-term value to taxpayers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The population of Melbourne is approximately 87,000 with over 150,000 during the day. The Fire Department has experienced an increase in call volume and has exercising as many options as it can to reduce response times to emergencies. Fire Station alerting and traffic preemption are the only remaining efforts that can be made in assisting to keep emergency response times down, outside of placing new apparatus on the streets. Response times are critical to the outcomes of the emergencies that are responded to on a daily basis. The quicker the information can be delivered from the dispatch center to the crews working in the fire stations the quicker they can respond to the emergency and take the appropriate actions to mitigate the situation. The department has a current project to employ traffic preemption thus leaving station alerting as the last opportunity to improve response times.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduction in the average turnout time (dispatch to wheels rolling) by 20-30 seconds per incident as well as total response time measured through CAD data. Achieve 99.9% system uptime through redundant dispatch pathways.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

City of Melbourne contracts include a liquidated damages provision in the amount of \$500 per day. This penalty is enforced when a contractor fails to complete the project within the contract time limits. If requested, this amount can be increased or decreased based upon State of Florida guidelines.
