The City of Coral Springs has several sensitive sites, including water treatment facilities, City Hall with offices for state and federal officials, and a public safety building. To enhance safety, the City plans to install ballistic film in key areas, providing greater protection for visitors, employees, and dignitaries while reducing risks of serious injury or death from potential threats.

The city will add ballistic film to specific areas at sensitive locations that will allow for greater protection of visitors, employees, and dignitaries – enhancing the overall safety and preventing threats from causing serious injury or death.

Citizens will have increased protection when visiting city buildings. Enhanced security at the water treatment plant will ensure potable water for citizens is protected from contamination.

The target population is the general public. Over 135,000 individuals will be served.

The expected benefit is to improve overall safety and prevent threats from causing serious injury or death to the general public. Outcome will be measured by conducting vulnerability/risk assessments before and after installation to quantify reduced exposure.
