### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Law enforcement faces the challenge of maintaining public safety while apprehending those who attempt to flee. Vehicle pursuits, though sometimes necessary, create serious risks for the public, officers, and suspects. To address this, the proposed equipment will be installed on marked and unmarked patrol vehicles and strategically deployed to prevent suspects from escaping after committing crimes.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will support purchasing and installing pursuit-prevention equipment on marked and unmarked patrol vehicles, training officers on safe use, updating policies, and strategically deploying equipped vehicles. These actions reduce high-speed pursuit risks, enhance public and officer safety, and improve the effectiveness of suspect apprehension.

p d	The requested funding will directly enhance public safety by reducing the risks associated with dangerous vehicle bursuits. Citizens will benefit from safer streets, as patrol vehicles equipped with pursuit-prevention technology will leter suspects from fleeing and minimize the likelihood of high-speed chases through neighborhoods and major badways.
