Improvements to the intersection will include a fully signalized intersection at Stadium and Cuddington and will include the addition of ADA compliant sidewalks at the intersection crossings.

By constructing the intersection improvements, roadway users will find the intersection to be a safe mode of transportation for those using motor vehicles, buses, and other modes of transportation such as grade school walkers and bikers as well as parents driving a golf carts.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are those students and general public that are using the intersection to get to school or traverse the roadway at the intersection.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is a safe intersection for both pedestrians, active transportation users, and roadway users. This will be measured by a decrease in traffic incidents at the intersection

The County's contracts for construction include comprehensive provisions that address failure to perform, including liquidated damages for not achieving Substantial Completion, and termination.
