13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Safe buildings are important for children and adults with disabilities because they allow for more equal access and opportunities. Secure buildings with appropriate hardening and physical security enhancements are critical when supporting vulnerable people with disabilities. Safe and secure buildings ensure that children and adults with disabilities are able to fully participate in quality programs and activities that enhance their quality of life.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Services which operate at Arc Broward's campus are life-changing for 370+ children and adults with disabilities. Preschool services are provided to toddlers preparing for eventual inclusion in their neighborhood elementary school. Transition services are provided for youth preparing for adulthood where they can learn to be independent and economically stable. Specialized day services are offered for those who are prematurely aging or who have significant behavioral challenges and cannot be served in other programs due to these challenges. Respite services are offered to families in need of support to stabilize their families. All of these activities need to occur in safe, secure buildings.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Comprehensive educational, developmental, and health related services and supports are provided in the multiple classrooms, meeting rooms, and common areas throughout campus. These spaces are designed to meet the unique needs of children and adults with disabilities, including being fully equipped with specialized furniture and adaptive & therapeutic materials, technology and supplies that are used as a part of highly structured instruction and program design.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

On any given day, the campus supports over 370 children and adults with complex disabilities and their families, 200+ team members and 20 volunteers/guests. The campus serves as a community hub, of sorts, and hosts meetings for stakeholder groups and customers of our mission based enterprises, Arc Culinary and Arc Educates.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased participation: Accessible and safe buildings encourage children and adults with disabilities to fully participate in programs and activities that impact their quality of life.

Improved independence: Secure buildings promote a sense of security and feeling less vulnerable for users. Increased sense of security: Safe and secure environments are imperative to establish a sense of relief among individuals who are more prone to be victims of adversities.
